Next week will mark our 10th Vacation Bible School (VBS) program

since restarting it in 2016. At that time, our church had only two members who were of VBS age. I'm encouraged by the faith of Pastor Joel, Susan, and others who stepped out to begin it again that year. By the grace of God, they were able to serve a total of seven children, all between the ages of 3 and 5.

Last year, we had 33 children in attendance, divided into three classes, plus six more in the nursery. Hi everyone,

This email is a short update on what's happening in our lives right now. We want to update you on a lot of upcoming travel and ask for prayers. Also, I've attached a couple of fun pictures from the end of Trent's junior year.

- 1. We're in the middle of "cry week" in Ukarumpa. This is the week where all of the seniors, their families, and many others leave Ukarumpa. Many of them will return after a 6 month or year of home assignment; however, there are others (namely the seniors) that will never return. This year, our family is losing some very close friends: Trent's best friend, Nehemiah, just graduated, and Kristy's best friend (and my principal). Please pray that these goodbyes will remind us of our shared eternity together with Jesus.
- 2. Trent will be leaving Ukarumpa tomorrow to return to Minnesota for 3.5 weeks to visit some colleges and receive some needed dental and orthodontic work. Kristy and I will be staying behind due to finances and clinic needs. However, Trent won't be traveling alone; he will be tagging along (in both directions) with another family who is traveling to the US for the school break. Once in Minnesota, he will be staying with grandparents so many of you will get to see him! Please be in prayer for travel mercies and smooth transfers in both directions.
- 3. Later this week, Kristy will be traveling to the capital of Papua New Guinea (PNG), Port Moresby with other leaders of our mission. The purpose will be to connect with government officials who oversee the medical industry and work through some logistical difficulties that she has been having with licensing, personnel, etc. Please pray that these officials will see the good work that our mission is doing and will look kindly on the clinic's applications.
- 4. Finally, at the beginning of July, Kristy and I will be traveling down to Brisbane, Australia as Kristy will be representing the Ukarumpa Clinic at a medical missions conference. We will tack on a few days before the conference for relaxation and refreshment. And, it just so happens that Trent will be returning via Brisbane while we're there, so we will be able to pick him up and then travel back to PNG as a family. Pray that this time will refresh us, and the conference will result in many more medical personnel catching the vision of serving God in Ukarumpa.

Thank you for your prayers and encouragement.



Our wonderful baby boy has arrived! Noah came in the afternoon on Wednesday, July 9th. After around a day and a half of labor, he ended up being delivered via C-section. We have never been so in love and in awe! For me, there is a song that I listened to a lot while pregnant, and one line stands out to me as the most true:

"Baby, when your arms are around me I swear that I'm holding the sun."

This is true for how I feel about both my son and my husband, who has been the absolute hero of our household. From feeding me while I feed our son, to bathing us both, cleaning and grocery shopping, Saul has literally done it all. I also want to thank my mom and mother-in-law for being with us every step of the way, cooking and bringing food, buying clothes for our son and helping us figure out government paperwork. It has been the wildest 2 week of our lives.

We are now in the thick of newborn life, which has its ups and downs. The difficulty has increased since Saul returned to work yesterday so prayers for patience, peace and rest are very much needed.

We are also still in need of funds to pay for Noah's birth, which ended up being more expensive because of my unplanned C-section. The Mexican government also just last month changed the laws, and to get my name on Noah's birth certificate is ten times more complicated and costly than we anticipated. We are needing around \$1500 for both things and we are asking if you would prayerfully consider supporting us in this way. Thank you!
