From the Pastor's Office

Welcoming Everyone to Hear God's Word

I recently made a video about the banners posted

in front of our church. The video was created as a marketing tool to invite people—especially those unsure whether they'd be welcome—to come and see what we're all about.

A few people responded to the video. One man asked, "What would happen if I came to the church and told a couple of people next to me that I was an atheist?" I told him I believe people would say, "We're glad you're here," and I encouraged him to come and find out for himself.

Most of the comments centered around whether we welcome people who are gay or transgender. I responded that yes, we do. I tried to gently explain the difference between **how someone is**—a broken sinner—and **who they are**—a person made in the image of God. I avoided using the old phrase "love the sinner, hate the sin" because that language doesn't always connect anymore. In today's culture, many people equate what they do with who they are. One commenter even quoted that phrase to argue that such an approach is a form of "intolerant tolerance."

Using Facebook and the banners outside our church gives us a unique opportunity to invite hundreds of people who drive by or scroll past. The goal of these messages is twofold:

- If someone is curious about Christianity, I hope they would feel welcome to come and learn more as we study God's Holy Word.
- If someone has a dark past and feels disqualified because of their sin, I hope they'll realize that if we'd welcome someone who isn't

even a Christian, then of course we'd welcome a believer with a troubled history as well.

Whether someone is gay, trans, straight, male, female, Black, white, brown, Christian, atheist, or follows another religion—we welcome them to join us in encountering the Word of God.

We all need God's Word. We all need to be reminded of who we are and what He has done for us through the sending of His Son, Jesus, to die for our sins. So even if someone doesn't realize it yet, we already have something in common when they walk through our doors. A simple, sincere "Hi, we're so glad you're here!" can be the very thing they've been longing to hear in a world full of noise and conflicting voices.

When my wife and I were dating, she visited our church one Sunday while I wasn't there. She had to work after the service and planned to leave quickly and quietly without staying for coffee. But she didn't make it halfway down the sidewalk before someone came outside, greeted her, and said they were happy to see her. It's something she still appreciates about our congregation—that visitors are **seen**, **loved**, **and welcomed**. Our church family is truly good at this, and it doesn't go unnoticed.

So what do we do when someone walks through our doors who is broken or hurting—maybe even in more visible ways than our own brokenness? We do what we always do: we greet them. We welcome them with a kind smile, a warm "God's Peace," and a heartfelt "We're so glad you're here."

This kind of personal, authentic welcome is often what makes the biggest impact on someone who responded to a banner or a video invitation.

Everyone is welcome to join us in encountering God's Holy Word!
