From the Pastor's Office Thanksgiving used to be my favorite holiday. The reason being that Christmas was over commercialized and Easter with its Easter bunny didn't make a lot of sense to me. But the idea of being thankful appealed to me in my mixed-up worldview of spirituality and positive thinking and having a favorite holiday that was different from most peoples was my nonconformist way.

Now my theology is better but I'm still a nonconformist in that my favorite holidays aren't really days instead they are seasons. I like the seasons of Advent and Easter best. Spending time in churches that use the old lectionaries (the reading in the church calendar) that have been used from the time of the early church has given me a greater appreciation for these seasons.

There are seven Sundays of Easter plus The Ascension of our Lord in this season making it 8 weeks total. During this time, we focus on the resurrection of Christ. His resurrection is a foreshadowing of ours. This is our greatest hope. The world will keep on doing what the world does. We will find the things we learn in the news to be disturbing and troublesome but Christ is victorious.

Chris's death on the cross not only justified and sanctified us, it gave us victory over sin and death. Understanding the first of those is hard enough for some. We receive by faith that Jesus took our sin on Himself and paid the penalty for it. He also gave us His righteousness. Christ's righteousness has been given to us meaning those good works that He did are our good works. That is awesome because our good works are always technically corrupted somehow by our own selfishness.

He also gave victory over sin, death, and the devil when He rose from the dead. Now we gain the victory through Him. We have a 3-fold enemy and Christ has made us victorious over all three.

Sin is our enemy. We don't play with the enemy who wants to kill us. That is why we turn our back on sin and fight temptation. Death is our enemy as well and it is the result of sin. Consider this while reading **Romans 6:20-23. 20** For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness.**21** But what fruit were you getting at that time from the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death. **22** But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life. **23** For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Every time someone dies, they prove the above scripture and we can be sure of one thing. That person was a sinner. They died because that is what they earned by singing. Thanks to God that His free gift to us is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord! That is why His coming to us in the flesh to not only die for our sins but also to be raised from the dead are the greatest events in human history since our creation and we look forward to another great event that we are often reminded of in Christian funerals when Christ will return and then our faith will be sight. He will come to judge the living and the dead. He will also give us all new bodies for those who have died and those who are still alive. Then He will join heaven and earth and will live in the longest church season ever when we live forever with Him in glorified bodies in a world without our enemies. No Devil, no death, and no sin!
